Tips from Chelsea Friedenbach and Sreelatha Ponnuveettil: Speech Language Pathologists

Developing language skills in your child can be done with simple everyday task. Here are some ideas:

- It is fine to use language structure and vocabulary that is higher than what your child uses. They absorb like sponges. Students develop receptive language understanding before the use it expressively.
- Grocery shopping is a great time to develop language. Make a list at home before hand with your child. This will help them to build a metal picture of the item. Once at the store, use adjectives to describe what you buy ("Here is a nice red, round apple."). Have them count out how many items you are buying.
- Increase and create communication opportunities: Target the same word or phrase all day!
- Be forgetful: Let your child ask for what they need.
- Be silly: Get your child's attention with unexpected actions.
- Follow your child's lead and play: Talk about their interests.
