LEADER IN ME (LIM)

April focus:

Habit 5: Seek first to Understand and then to be understood

This habit strengthens relationships, reduces misunderstandings, and increases trust.

Try this at home:

Invite your child to Play "Mixed Up Simon Says"

- Tell your child, If I say, "Simon says..." you should not do what I say but do what I do. You
 will need to listen and watch very carefully because this will be tricky
- Touch your ears as you say, "Simon says, Touch your toes."
- Congratulate your child for listening carefully to your verbal cue.
- Touch your eye as you say "Simon says, Touch your elbow."
- Play several rounds, communicating one action with your words and a different action with your movement.

Ask your child these questions:

- Have you ever felt misunderstood?
- Why is listening to understand the other person so important?
- · What do you think is the single most important communication skill?
