LRT = Language Review Team



Purpose

- to screen, monitor, and address any academic concerns individual English learners incur while acquiring English.
- The team reports on strengths, areas for improvements, findings, and makes recommendations to support student learning
- to determine reclassification of eligible students.

- Classroom Teachers
- Instructional Coach
- Administrators
- ELAT Representatives/MTSS Team Lead

RECLASSIFICATION

- When students are able to demonstrate proficiency in English, they are considered for Reclassification.
- Reclassification is not the end of support for your student!
- All students who are reclassified are closely monitored for 4 years to make sure they continue to make strong progress across academic areas.
- The Language Review Team meets twice per year to monitor the progress of all reclassified students.

RECLASSIFICATION

Based on:

- Overall score of 4 on ELPAC
- Reading skills measured through classroom testing
- Writing skills measured through samples
- Teacher recommendation
- Parent opinion
- Consideration by Language Review Team (LRT)


