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5. A. Approval of Change Order #018 – Bishop Elementary School Modernization – Increment 1 & 2 – USS Cal Builders

Description

Pursuant to Public Contract Code, all change orders must be ratified by the Board of Education. This change order represents the eighteenth formal Change Order for the Bishop Elementary School – Increment 1&2 Project and documents unforeseen conditions found during construction and added work requested by the District not identified in the original scope of work. Once ratified by the Board of Education, the contractor can invoice for work associated with this Change Order.

The original contract price awarded by the Board of Education to USS Cal Builders was \$24,699,000.

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5. B. Appointment of Membership for Citizens' Bond and Parcel Tax Oversight Committee

Description

The Sunnyvale School District was successful at the Measure "G" in November of 2013 authorizing the issuance \$96 million of general obligation bonds and Measure "GG" in November of 2018 authorizing the issuance of \$100 million of general obligation bonds. In addition, the District was successful at an election held in November of 2016, in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to levy a qualified special tax, known as a "parcel tax", commencing July 1, 2018 for a period of 7 years for a variety of planned program and operational uses. As a part of the compliance process the Board of Education established a Citizens' Bond and Parcel Tax Oversight Committee for the purpose of informing the public, reviewing expenditures and preparing an annual report to the Board of Education that states whether the District is in compliance with the voter approved expenditures and to provide a summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.

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5. C. Adoption of Revised Board Policy 5141.52 - Suicide Prevention

Description

Dr. Tasha Dean stated that Board Policy 5141.52 - Suicide Prevention was updated to reflect NEW LAW (AB 2639) which requires boards of districts that serve grades 7-12 to review the district's suicide prevention policy at least every five years and update it as necessary.

Policy was reviewed and discussed at a regular board meeting on January 9, 2020. Dr. Dean was instructed to return the policy on consent. The board policy is available for public inspection in the Office of the Superintendent.

Recommendation

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education adopt revised Board Policy 5141.52 - Suicide Prevention.



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5. D. Adoption of New Board Policy - Inclusion

Description

Dr. Tasha Dean stated that new Board Policy - Inclusion sets a vision and provides recommendations to our schools and community for increasing the inclusion of ALL students, including students with disabilities, in high-quality programs. It is the District's position that all students with disabilities should have access to inclusive high-quality programs, where they are provided with individualized and appropriate support in meeting high expectations. It is our shared vision that students be meaningfully included in all facets of society throughout the life course. This begins in early childhood programs and continues into schools, places of employment, and the broader community. Inclusion early in programs can set a trajectory for inclusion across the life course.

Policy was reviewed and discussed at a regular board meeting on January 9, 2020. Dr. Dean was instructed to return the policy on consent. The board policy is available for public inspection in the Office of the Superintendent.

Recommendation

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education adopt new Board Policy - Inclusion.



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5. E. Adoption of Revised Board Policy 6142.1 - Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Instruction

Description

Ms. Mala Ahuja stated that Board Policy 6142.1 - Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Instruction has been updated to more directly reflect the goals of the California Healthy Youth Act and reflect new law which requires districts offering grades 6-12 to provide information on human trafficking prevention resources to parents/guardians that they may request to excuse their child from comprehensive sexual health and HIV prevention education.

Bylaw was reviewed and discussed at a regular board meeting on January 9, 2020. Ms. Ahuja was instructed to return the policy on consent. The board policy is available for public inspection in the Office of the Superintendent.

Recommendation

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education adopt revised Board Policy 6142.1 - Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Instruction.
