Dear Charger Families,

It's hard to believe that we are already entering the month of October. There are so many things to look forward to this month. For example, the Golden Shoe competition starts this month. We are having our first parent education night on October 11, and the Halloween Parade and Fall Festival are on October 26. We will be sharing more details about these events in our weekly updates.

Monday, October 3, is the start of the Golden Shoe Competition!

The Golden Shoe Competition is our way of encouraging all of our students to walk or roll to school.

Walking or rolling to school is excellent for the environment. It helps prevent heavy car traffic right around drop-off time. And best of all, our students will be healthier by doing it!

Teachers have put up a tally sheet outside the classroom. Each student should check off the days they walk or roll to school. Even if you can't walk or roll from home, students can check the tally sheet if they walked or rolled from or beyond Knickerbocker, Lynn, and Mango.

At the end of each month, we will announce the winners at the Friday Flag assembly, and there will be prizes for individual students and classrooms with the highest totals or most improvement from month to month.

Let's all walk and roll to school!

Our priority is the safety of all of our students. We also want to make sure every child continues to show their Charger Pride by being safe to school and from school.

If your child walks or bikes to school, here are some tips:

- 1. Wear a helmet. Bicycle helmets significantly reduce the chance of brain injury. It should be snug but not too tight, with the brim about an inch to a half above your child's eyebrows.
- 2. Cyclists must obey motor vehicle laws. That includes yielding to pedestrians, stopping for stop signs, signaling turns, and traveling with traffic flow.
- 3. They're more likely to be seen if they're wearing bright clothes. They should also make eye contact with drivers when crossing the street.
- 4. Stay on sidewalks whenever possible. If there aren't sidewalks, walk toward oncoming traffic to see what's coming.
- 5. Look left, right, and left again before crossing the street. Continue looking in each direction as you travel.

- 6. Be alert. Having your eyes on your smartphone means they aren't on the road or in traffic. Headphones aren't the best idea, either.
- 7. Use crosswalks to cross the street, and don't cross the road between parked cars.

April 27th at 2:10 pm-Earthquake and Fire Drill

May 11th at 8:20 am-Fire Drill

June 12th at 10 am-Fire Drill

Parents, please mark your calendars so you know when we are conducting our drills. We recommend you talk to your child about emergency preparedness and why we prepare and conduct drills.
