Dear Students & Families,

I am so excited to be part of your middle school journey and to be teaching 7th Grade Math & Science this year. In my class, we focus on building up students through academic language and hands on activities that help students engage with the curriculum in authentic and enduring ways. The Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) go beyond memorization and ask students to apply concepts. All year, students will write following the CER (claim, evidence, reasoning) format. This is the foundation of all science writing, as it focuses on connecting facts and evidence with sound reasoning. In math, students will extend their knowledge of geometry as we explore the area of circles and expand their ratio and proportional reasoning. Students will also build on their algebraic thinking and problem solving skills.

I am including information about expectations and supplies for my room as well as my testing, grading, and homework policies. These policies are subject to change as required throughout the year. Please review and discuss the next few pages with your family. SMS is a PBIS school which means that behaviors are explicitly taught and rewarded. I believe that when students know what is expected of them, they will rise to meet those demands. I also believe in consequences that help to address and correct behaviors. I will communicate with students, families, administrators and support staff as needed to help students be successful. I welcome your comments and feedback about anything that might be helpful for me or the school to know.

Grading Policy

At Sunnyvale Middle School, we practice Standards Based Grading. This means that assignments and tests will receive a score from 1 – 5.

Scores of 3 and below do not represent proficiency and are not considered "passing." All students can achieve proficiency and are expected to be proficient in all standards. If a score less than 4 is earned on a test, the student should talk to Mrs. Rodriguez to get extra help and set up a time to retake the test.

Students are expected to review their graded assignments to see what comments were made and to make sure their answers were assessed correctly. If you have any questions about a grade or comment you earned, see Mrs. Rodriguez!

Homework Policy

- Homework scores are represented on report cards as Lifelong Learning Completion of Assignments. Homework is graded based on: completeness, neatness, and effort.
- Homework <u>may</u> be assigned Monday Friday and assignments will be posted on the board each day. Weekly and monthly projects <u>may</u> also be assigned. Students are responsible for writing down all assignments in their planner every day. Yes, every day.
- All papers must have the student's first and last names and be legible. Paper torn from spiral bound notebooks will not be accepted.
- Students who are absent are responsible for recording the missed assignments into their planner and have as many days as they were absent to make up the work. All papers will be in the student's individual file when they return. It is their responsibility to check their file and follow up with a classmate or with Mrs. Rodriguez.
- I understand how busy and complicated lives can be and that, occasionally, circumstances may arise that prevent a student from doing homework. If a situation arises, please have your student discuss the situation with me personally. My priority is to help your student be successful, teach them responsibility, and of course, for them to learn.

Test Retake Policy

Students may retake any test within the trimester that it was given. Retakes may be written, 1:1 conversations with a teacher, or another activity that allows a student to show what they know. Students are expected to study or get extra help with concepts that they want to retake before retaking the test. If a student shows they have not studied, future retakes may not be possible. Students who want to retake a test must talk to Mrs. Rodriguez in advance.
