Over the next several weeks, students across Cumberland will take part in important **district and state assessments** that help us understand their academic progress and guide our planning for instruction, professional development, and school goals.

#### What's Happening?

- **Kindergarten-2nd Grade** students will take district benchmark assessments in reading and math using the NWEA platform.
  - This assessment is also given at the beginning of the year, December and March for all students K-5.
- **Grades 3-5** will take the CAASPP (California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress), measuring:



- English Language Arts (Literacy)
- Math
- Science (5th grade only CAST)

Score reports are typically mailed to families over the summer.

#### **How Are These Assessments Used?**

- Assessments provide valuable data to:
  - o Monitor individual student growth
  - Inform daily instruction and interventions
  - Shape schoolwide goals and teacher learning
- Throughout the year, teachers also use:
  - Daily progress monitoring
  - o Curriculum-embedded assessments
  - Student goal-setting and reflection
  - Engagement in learning activities

All of which contribute to a more complete picture of student learning and inform **report card** grades in core academic areas and lifelong learning skills as well as teacher comments.



#### **How You Can Help**

- To support your child especially if in grades 3-5:
  - Avoid scheduling appointments during this window of time
    - Particularly before lunch over the next 3 weeks
  - o Ensure a good night's sleep
  - Provide a healthy breakfast
  - Encourage them to do their best and show what they've learned!

#### LOOKING AHEAD - CREATING CLASSES FOR 25-26 SCHOOL YEAR

Next year, we plan to have the following classes at Cumberland:

**THE PROCESS:** Our teachers have begun the process of creating classes for next year. Each year we use an "anonymous build" system in which teachers have a spreadsheet for each class: Class A, Class B, Class C, etc. There will not be a teacher name associated with any of the classes being built. As professional educators, we take great care when developing class rosters. The teachers will create the needed number of classes, taking special care to balance them across the following characteristics: gender, English Learner status, academic performance, behavior, and family involvement. We also take into consideration which children work well together and those who do not. All of these decisions will help us create a dynamic learning environment for all children.

Once the classes have been created, they are turned in to Ms. Carlson. She takes into account the needs of individual children within the class and the ways they relate to various teacher styles before assigning a teacher to each class. As you can see, this process involves careful planning, and the hard work of our teams would be diminished if we accepted requests. For this reason, as has been the case in years past, specific teacher requests will not be accepted.

**CLASS LIST NOTIFICATION:** Class lists have typically been shared via School Messenger the Wednesday prior to the first day of school - we anticipate following the same protocol for 25/26.

**THANK YOU:** Thank you for placing your trust and confidence in our team of professional educators. We know that the dynamics of a classroom can have a profound impact on student learning, and we work hard to create the best possible classrooms for all students.

#### CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

We're excited to share that Cumberland will be undergoing several important upgrades to improve our campus facilities and learning environment.

#### **Drinking Fountain Project**

The district has launched a project to retrofit or install new drinking fountains across all campuses - starting with Cumberland! By the end of the project, each campus will have 3 fountains with filtered water bottle filling stations. At Cumberland, the drinking fountains near Kindergarten, Buildings B & C, and the Staff Room will be upgraded.

#### **Summer Maintenance Project**

This summer, the following improvements will take place in our permanent classrooms:

- HVAC system replacements
- Lighting upgrades
- Installation of new roller shades
- Flooring replacement
- Exterior painting of the campus

These updates will help ensure a more comfortable, functional, and welcoming space for students and staff when we return in the fall.

As for the portable classrooms (rooms 19-25), there is a longer term goal to replace them with higher quality facilities. At the Board Meeting in February, the board approved a project to replace the portables at Cumberland "within the next 2-5 years."

We're grateful for these investments in our school and can't wait for you to see the improvements!


**Deadline to order:** Yearbooks available to purchase up to May 12, 2025. You can purchase now and edit your custom pages up to May 12th.
