

<b>K/1</b>	Spanish	80%	Literacy (2.5 hrs./day) is introduced in Spanish to all students, as it is a critical learning tool for all subject matters. Mathematics (1 hr./day) is also taught in Spanish. Students receive science* and social studies* instruction in Spanish as well (0.5 hr./day). Other enrichment activities are also taught in Spanish (choice time, physical education, socio-emotional development)
	English	20%	In English Language Development, we will focus on developing oral language skills with a lesser focus on reading and writing in English (0.5 hr./day). Other enrichment activities are offered in English (art, physical education, library, field trips, assemblies, special events).

<b>2</b>	Spanish	70%	Spanish reading and writing continue to be developed through Language Arts (2hrs/day), Math (1hr./day), and Social Studies* (30 min) also continue in Spanish.
	English	30%	Starting this year Science* is taught in English (30 min.). English Language Development (40 min./day) and other enrichment programs, such as Class Gametime and Starting Arts, continue to be taught in English.

<b>3</b>	Spanish	60%	Spanish is developed through Spanish language arts (75 min./day), math (1 hr./day), and Social Studies (30 min/day). Students will continue to read and write in Spanish.
	English	40%	Language Arts is now introduced in English (45 min/day) and science (30 min) to ensure a proper transition. Students will be introduced to reading and writing in English.

<b>4/5</b>	Spanish	50%	Spanish is maintained in both grades with instruction in Spanish Language Arts (1.5 hrs./day) and math(1 hr./day) .
	English	50%	English is now on par with Spanish. English language arts (1 hr./day)receives less instructional time than Spanish language arts because science/social studies (0.5 hr./day) can act as additional literacy support. Math(1 hr./day).

<b>Additional Resources</b>	<b>Bridge/Transfer</b>	Students are explicitly guided to find commonalities and differences between Spanish and English, which makes learning more efficient for all.
	<b>ELD</b>	English Language Learners receive English Language Development (ELD) instruction, which supports the learning of the language at their language development level. Native English speakers also receive ELD to develop their academic language in English.
